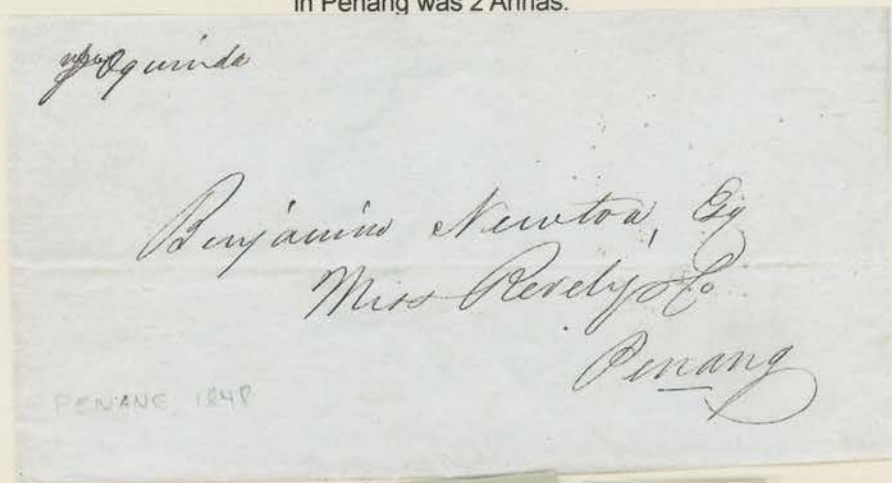


MALAYA - PENANG

Singapore to Penang

August/September 1848

Unpaid letter from Singapore to Penang, Malaya written on 30 August 1848. On arrival by ship in Penang the letter received a Penang bearing stamp of 18 September 1848 was applied. The rate payable in Penang was 2 Annas.



MALAYA - SINGAPORE

Singapore

July/September 1854

Unpaid entire from London postmarked 19 July 1854, to Singapore, Malaya, endorsed "via Benares". The letter has a "Calcutta/ Steam Letter/ 1854 Aug 28/ Bearing" mark applied in transit. The arrival mark of Singapore is undated but there is a manuscript notation to say that it was received on 2 September 1854. On arrival the letter appears to have been rated for postage due.



MALAYA - STRAITS SETTLEMENTS

via Singapore

May/July 1866

Unpaid letter from Rotterdam via France and c/o Singapore, Straits Settlements, Malaya eventually to Batavia, Dutch East Indies endorsed "via Marseilles" postmarked 10-5-1866. There are French transit marks of 2 and 11 June 1866 and a French accountancy mark of "FR/ 2F 16C" under the Anglo-French Convention of 1856.

There is a Singapore transit/arrival mark of ?July 1866 but no Batavia arrival mark although there is a manuscript "9" which might indicate postage due.



MALAYA - STRAITS SETTLEMENTS

Singapore

June/July 1866

Underpaid letter from Banbury, England to Singapore, Straits Settlements, Malaya endorsed "via Southampton" postmarked Ju 19 66 partly paid with a copy of the 6d of 1865. There is a London transit mark of *Jv 20 66* in red on the reverse. A boxed "excs oz./ Deficient Postage..6./ British Share of Fine..6." mark was also applied in London to mark the part payment. There is no Singapore arrival mark although there is a manuscript "1/=" rating mark.



MALAYA - STRAITS SETTLEMENTS

Singapore

March/April 1880

Underpaid British PSE (1d local rate) from London, England to Singapore, Straits Settlements, Malaya partly uprated with a ½d of 1870 and a 2½d of 1880 postmarked 5 March 1880 with the E29 Duplex of London. The rate was 6d and the deficiency 2d.

Also on the front is a London "T"(Taxe) mark together with an unpaid mark "value of stamps/ sum to be collected" 4 and 2. The mark, although recorded as a Singapore mark, seems to be a British underpaid mark struck in London.

There is also a Singapore unpaid arrival mark of 4 April 1880. The blue manuscript "4" seems to be the postage due doubled in pence or even the postage due collected as 4 cents.

MALAYA - STRAITS SETTLEMENTS

Singapore

July/August 1880

Front of letter from Manchester, England to Singapore, Straits Settlements, Malaya endorsed "Via Brindisi". Postage partly paid by 8d in British stamps postmarked 17 July 1880 with the 498 Duplex of Manchester.

On the front is a London "T"(Taxe) marking together with an unpaid marking denoting value of postage paid (8d) and to be collected (4d). This marking although recorded as a Singapore marking, seems to be a British underpaid marking struck in London (but not listed by Mackay or Whitney).

There is also a very faint Singapore arrival mark. The blue manuscript "8" may be the postage due doubled in pence or the postage due collected as 8 cents.



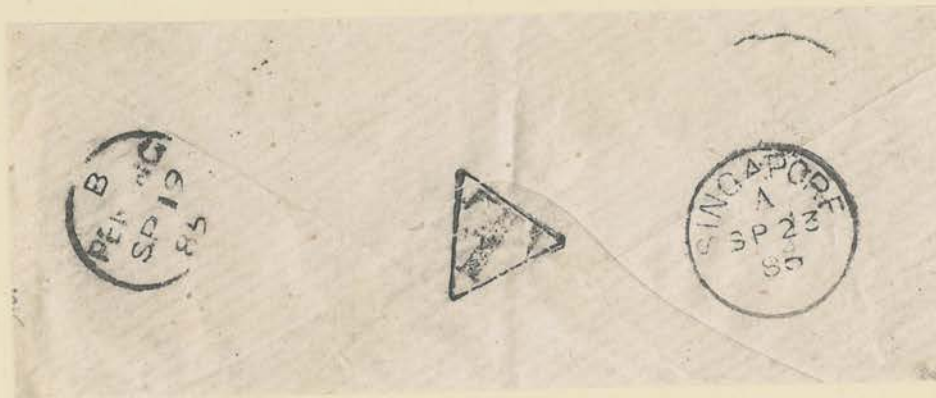
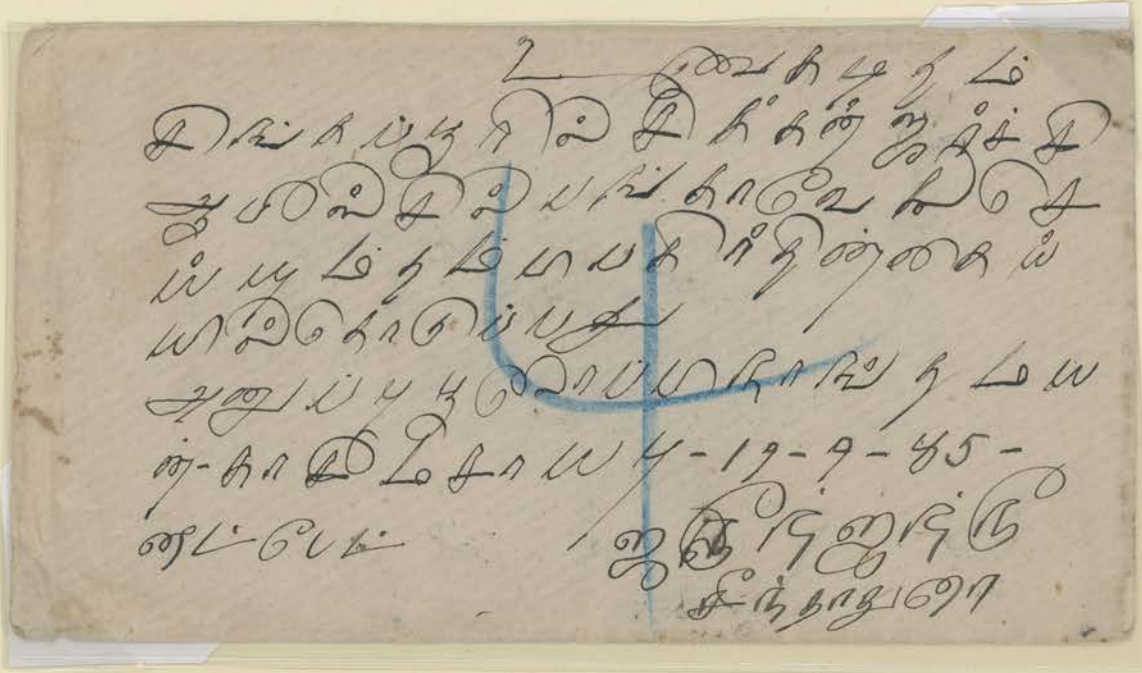
MALAYA - STRAITS SETTLEMENTS

Penang to Singapore

September 1885

Unpaid letter from Penang postmarked 19 September 1885 on the reverse to Singapore, Straits Settlements, Malaya. The rate, and the deficiency, was 2 cents.

There is a Penang "T" in an inverted triangle also on the reverse together with an arrival mark of Singapore of 23 September 1885. Postage due of 4 cents, being double the deficiency, is indicated by a large blue crayon manuscript "4" on the obverse.



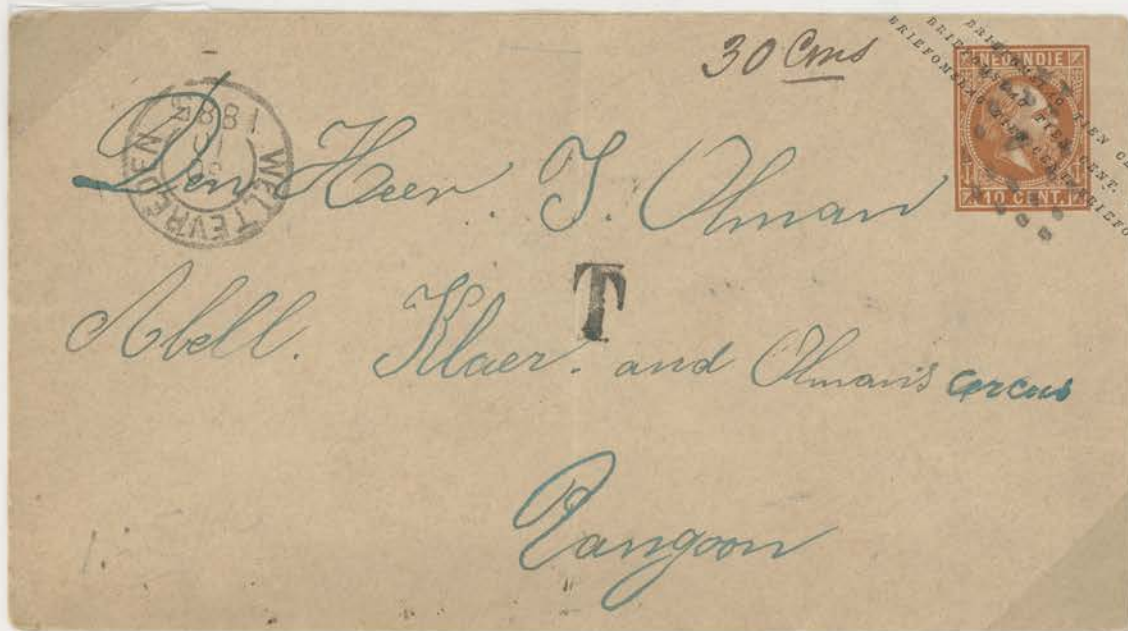
MALAYA - STRAITS SETTLEMENTS

via Singapore

September/November 1885

Underpaid 10 cents local rate PSE from Weltevreden, Dutch East Indies to Rangoon Burma via Singapore, Straits Settlements, Malaya postmarked 30 October 1885. The rate was 25 cents and the deficiency was 15 cents.

There is a DEI "T" (Tax) mark on the obverse. On the reverse there is a transit mark of Ned-Ind-Singapore of 4 November 1885 and a delivery mark of Rangoon of 14 November 1885. There is also as a boxed "Postage Due" with a manuscript "6" (Annas) inserted.



MALAYA - STRAITS SETTLEMENTS

via Singapore

September/November 1885

Unpaid letter from Karikal, French India to Deli, Netherlands East Indies via Singapore, Straits Settlements, Malaya postmarked 8 SEP 85. The rate and deficiency, in Indian currency, was 2½ Annas. There is an Indian "T" (Taxe) mark as well as a boxed "Postage Due". There is a Singapore transit mark of SEP 22 85, a Singapore postage due mark "16" and a "Ned Ind Singapore" transit mark of 7 11 1885. There is an arrival mark of 14 11 1885 of Deli and a large blue manuscript "40" to denote postage due.
