

FEDERATED MALAY STATES - MALAYAN POSTAL UNION

Selangor

December 1940/ January 1941

Indian KGVI Postal Stationery envelope with albino imprinted embossed stamp that was not noticed by the post office. The letter was treated as an underpaid letter from Kilasavalpatti, India to Kuala Lumpur, Selangor, Malaya. Postage partly paid by 2 copies of both the 3 pies and 1 Anna of 1937 on the reverse postmarked 27 December 1940. The newly increased rate was 3½ Annas, the deficiency was 1 Anna. On the obverse is an Indian "... C/ T" (Taxe) mark in a circle and a manuscript "14c" indicating double the deficiency in gold centimes. The letter has not been censored. The Kuala Lumpur arrival mark of 11 January 1941 is on a horizontal pair of the 1 cent and a single copy of the 4 cents postage due stamps of the Malayan Postal Union of 1936/38.

Pahang

December 1940/ January 1941

Unpaid letter from Sarakanei, Ramnad, India to Kuala Lipis, Pahang, Malaya postmarked on the reverse 28 December 1940. The rate had just been newly increased to 3½ Annas.

On the obverse is an Indian "T/ 50-C" (Taxe) mark in a circle indicating double the deficiency in gold centimes. It does not appear to have been censored. The Kuala Lipis arrival mark of 12 January 1941 is on a horizontal pair of the 10 cents 1936 postage due stamp of the Malayan Postal Union.

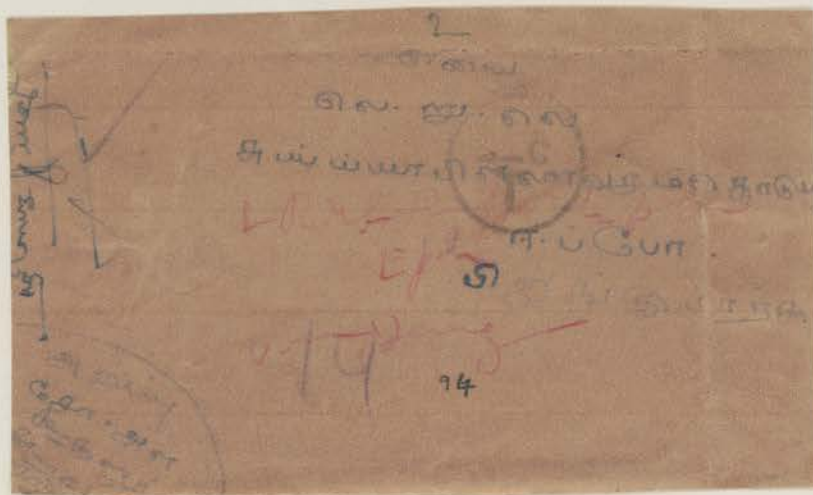

Perak

April 1941

Underpaid letter from Ramnad, India to Ipoh, Perak, Malaya postmarked 4 April 1941 on the reverse on a copy of the ½ Anna and 2 copies of the one Anna of 1937 to total 2½ Annas. There is also a transit mark of 4 April 1941 of Tiruppattur, India. The rate was 3½ Annas and the deficiency 1 Anna.

On the obverse is an Indian "... C/ T" (Tax) mark in a circle with a manuscript "14" to indicate double the deficiency in gold centimes. The letter does not appear to have been censored. The Ipoh arrival mark of 21 April 1941 on the reverse is on a single of the 4 cents and a pair of the one cent postage due stamps of the Malayan Postal Union of 1936/38.



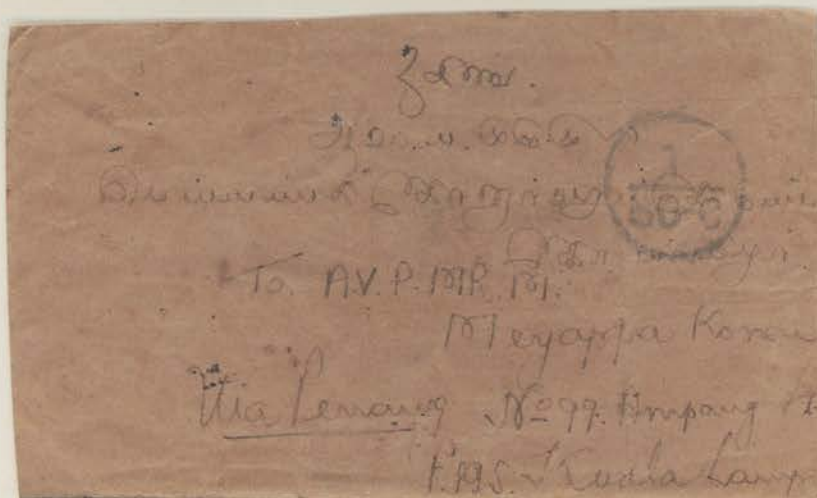

Selangor

April 1941

Unpaid letter from Karaikudi, India to Kuala Lumpur, Selangor, Malaya postmarked 4 April 1941. The rate and the deficiency was 3½ Annas.

On the reverse there is an Indian "T/ 50-C" mark to indicate double the deficiency in gold centimes. The arrival mark of Kuala Lumpur of April 1941 on the reverse is on two copies of the 10 cents postage due stamp of the Malayan postal union of 1936.

Perak and Penang

May/June 1941

Unpaid letter from Tranquebar, India initially to Sungei Siput. Perak, Malaya postmarked 29 May 1941 on the reverse. The rate, and the deficiency, was 3½ Annas.

On the obverse is an Indian "T/50-C" (Tax) mark in a circle indicating double the deficiency in gold centimes. The letter was not censored. The Sungei Siput arrival mark on the reverse of 13 June 1941 is on two copies of the 10 cents postage due stamp of the Malayan Postal Union of 1936. The letter was undeliverable and redirected to Penang, Straits Settlements. The postage due stamps were manuscript cancelled and acquired two further marks on the reverse and obverse of 13 June 1941.

On the way to in Penang the postage due stamps were officially cancelled in Taiping(?) with a "Charge not collected/ X/ Fresh label required". On arrival in Penang a vertical pair of the 10 cents postage due stamp of the Malayan Postal Union of 1936 was applied and cancelled 17 June 1941.



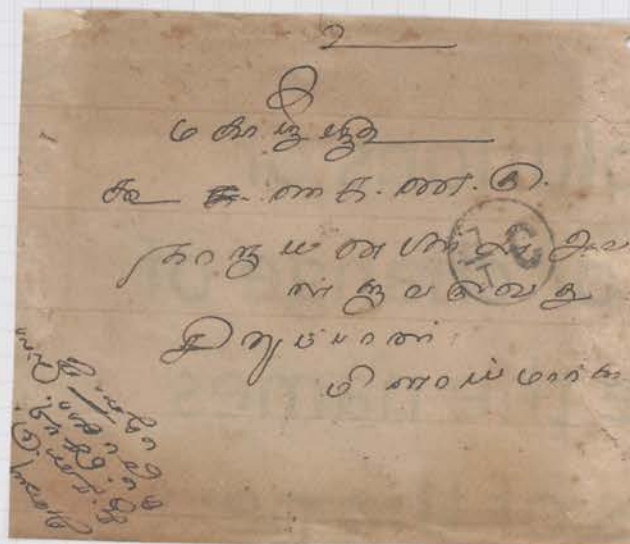

Negri Sembilan

July/August 1941

Underpaid letter from Melur, Madura, India to Seremban, Negri Sembilan, Malaya postmarked 28 July 1941 on 3 copies of the 1 Anna of 1937 on the reverse. The rate was $3\frac{1}{2}$ Annas and the deficiency $\frac{1}{2}$ Anna.

On the obverse is an Indian "7 C/T" (Taxe) mark in a circle indicating double the deficiency in gold centimes. The letter does not appear to have been censored. The Seremban arrival mark on the reverse of 8 August 1941 is a copy of the 4 cents MPU postage due stamp of 1936.



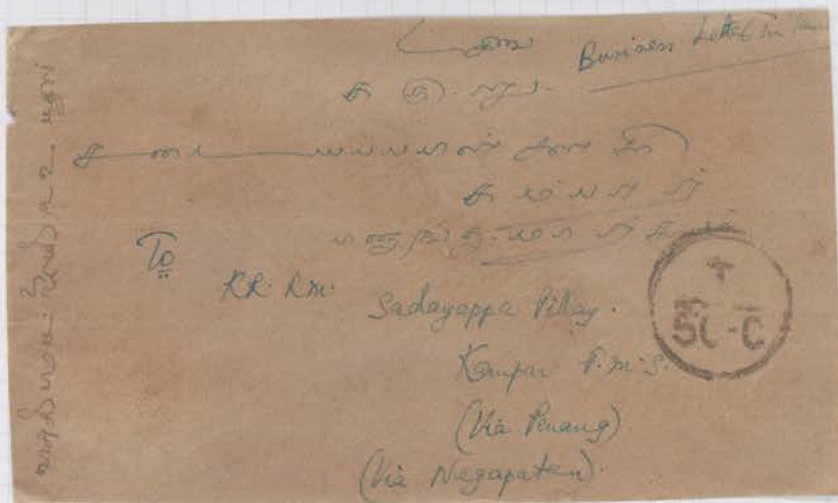

Perak

September 1941

Unpaid letter from Devakottai, India to Kampar, Perak, Malaya postmarked 2 September 1941 on the reverse.

On the obverse is an Indian "T/ 50-C" (Taxe) mark in a circle indicating double the deficiency in gold centimes. The letter does not appear to have been censored. The Kampar arrival mark on the reverse of 19 September 1941 is on a horizontal pair of the 10 cents postage due stamps of the Malayan Postal Union of 1936 making a total of 20 cents.

Perak

October 1941

Indian KGVI Postal Stationery envelope (internal letter rate of 1 Anna 3 Pies) from Nachandupa, India to Taiping, Perak, Malaya postmarked 8 October 1941 on the reverse on a copy of the 1¼ Annas of 1940. The rate was 3¼ Annas and the deficiency 1 Anna.

On the obverse is an Indian "14/ T C" (Taxe) mark in a circle indicating double the deficiency in gold centimes. The letter does not appear to have been censored. The Taiping arrival mark on the reverse, of 17 October 1941, indicating a transit period of 9 days, is on two copies of the 1 cent and one copy of the 4 cents postage due stamps if 1936/38 of the MPU making a total of 6 cents.

October 1941

Perak

Underpaid airmail letter from India to Parit Buntar, Perak, Malaya partly paid by a 1 Rupee and a 12 Annas of 1937/40 postmarked 9 October 1941. The letter appears to have been for this triple weight letter was 2 Rupees and 10 Annas and the deficiency was 14 Annas. Also on the obverse is a blue manuscript "200 CT" Indian (T axe) mark indicating double the deficiency in gold centimes. The letter is censored, marked and resealed in India. On arrival in Parit Buntar the post office found the letter open and applied a "Post Office/ Found open (or torn) officially secured" label which is date stamped 21 October 1941. The same mark is also on the reverse on copies of the 4 cents and 10 cents (3) of 1938 postage stamps making up a total of 84 cents.
