Kelantan via Penang

Underpaid letter from Kuala Krai, Kelantan, Malaya to Medan, Netherlands East Indies, Malaya postmarked 6 December 1925 on a copy of the 5 cents of 1922. The rate was 12 cents and the deficiency was 7 cents. Postage due was marked by a Kuala Krai "T" mark in a triangle and a blue manuscript "30c" to denote double the deficiency in gold centimes.

On the reverse there are transit marks of Penang of 18 December and Medan of 19 December 1925. On the obverse the postage due is collected by means of a 15 cents postage due stamp of 1913 of the Netherlands East Indies postmarked 19 December 1925.

Letter from Kota Bharu, Kelantan, Malaya to Harrisburg, United States paid with single copies of the 1 cent, 2 cents, 4 cents and 5 cents all postmarked 8 April 1939 to make up the correct rate of 12 cents. By mistake a Kota Bharu "T" (Taxe) mark was applied but was deleted as applied in error.

Postage Due Stamps

Following the issue of the Malayan Postal Union postage due stamps the state of Trengganu decided that it should have its own postage due stamps as it had decided not to join the postal union.

The design, the Printer (De La Rue), the watermark (Multiple Script CA sideways) and the printing method (Typography) was used for all the printings of these postage due stamps until the Japanese occupation during the second world war. All the printings of the stamps were in sheets of 100 stamps with jubilee lines all around and without plate numbers.



These stamps are, to date, not known used on cover although they are believed to exist used on piece.
